From The President

Security - **In the effort of providing a safe neighborhood for us all, you or your family may be asked to provide identification when using WF common areas.

The lake has once again become a hot spot for everyone to enjoy. We must ask that you have the proper Identification on you or in your car. Please use the ID tags that were issued last year. If you have lost yours a replacement is available from the office for \$5.00. In order to receive an ID tag, your Maintenance Assessment **must be paid** in full. If you have guests visiting with you and they wish to use the common area that's great! But they must have your ID tag with them or they could be asked to leave the property. Our goal is to keep the lake clean and the surrounding area safe for all of our residents and their guests. Remember that ALL Common area's close at dusk. We have a Metro Police Officer on duty at various times and is enforcing the ID tags and also giving out tickets for speeding and for trespassing, also **The dam is restricted by order of the Core of Engineers. No fishing or loitering is permitted on the dam at any time.**



Regulations **prohibit any motorized vehicles (dirt bikes, ATVs, motorcycles, etc...) in the common areas, trails, lake areas and playgrounds.** Recently, we have had some difficulty with cars being parked off the road near the lake. This is strictly prohibited and will be enforced legally . Please make any members of your household aware of these regulations as to keep their vehicle from being ticketed and/or towed from the property at their expense.

Also, remind your household of the regulations when using Windsor Forest grounds. Swimming and motorized boating are **not permitted** at the lake at anytime. Paddle boats are permitted **with Coast Guard approved life preservers worn at all times.** The lake and playgrounds close at **DUSK** and the **basketball and tennis courts shall not be used after dusk.**

A) It shall be unlawful for any owner or person in charge of a dog, cat, ferret, or other four-footed mammal, poultry or other fowl to permit such animal to be on school grounds, metro parks or other public property, or on any private property other than that of the owner or person in charge or control of such animal without the permission of the owner of said property, or on any streets, sidewalks, highways, or rights-of-way of the Metro Government other than duly designated bridle paths, unless the owner or person in charge of such animals:

(1) Has, in his or her possession, a suitable device for the picking up, collection and proper sanitary disposal of the animal feces or manure.

(2) Immediately removes all feces deposited by such animal's) and disposes of same in a sanitary manner.

(B) This section shall not apply to blind or visually impaired persons accompanied by an assistance dog. (Lou. Metro Ord. No. 97-2003, approved 5-16-2003; Lou. Metro Am. Ord. No. 233-2006, approved 1-4-2007) [Penalty, see § 91.999](#)

Clarification of the State of the Neighborhood Address

... In the March 2007 WF newsletter it was reported that "the police would not press charges because they did not see him go thru the sign." In reference to the hit and run accident which destroyed the sign at Arnotldtown Rd and Windsor Forest Dr. I want to clarify that the Police (I) did in fact press charges including leaving the scene of an Accident and Criminal Mischief in conjunction with taking the collision report, having the vehicle which was left at the scene impounded, and conducted follow up investigations. It was the Jefferson County Commonwealth Attorney's office which refused to formally pursue my charges in a court of law by issuing an arrest warrant for the suspect involved. The prosecutors Office effectively halted pursuit of any restitution through criminal courts regardless of the fact that crimes obviously occurred and evidence left at the scene including the vehicle and subsequent criminal investigations, the office claimed it unsubstantial enough to pursue on the Neighborhoods behalf. Collection of restitution through civil litigation against the suspect was therefore suggested. I wanted to ensure that residents were secure in knowing it was not my or any other police officer's shortcomings which resulted in criminal charges not being pursued in court.
