Line trail area with timbers

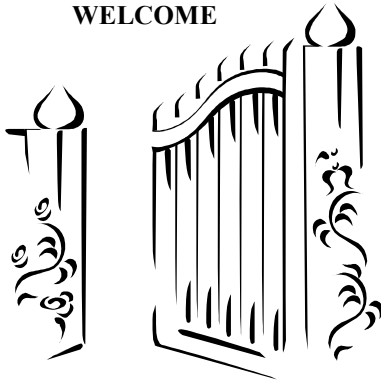
Flat bottom canoe w/ someone to pull trash from lake (grabber with a handle would be helpful)

I have been asked to address several residents' questions and concerns regarding loud vehicles with both operational and manufactured noise. While it would seem common sense and simple courtesy not to disturb the peace, loud music and noise are among the highest reported complaints in the neighborhood. Historically, behavior and respect for the rights of others to live peacefully has had to be governed by laws and ordinances. Some of those spanning nearly 70 years are still enforceable and applicable today while others have more recently been adopted by the Legislature. Laws which endure decades and foster newer similar laws illustrate the importance of the subject matter that they govern. The Louisville Metro Noise Ordinance is perhaps the most often applied law to address these problems, however, some others are listed below. The protection of peaceful surroundings and the enjoyment of life is well legislated, and it is enforced.

1. Chapter 99 of the Louisville-Jefferson County Metro Codified Ordinances —

“It shall be unlawful for any person within Louisville Metro to make, continue or cause to be made or continued, any unreasonable loud, harsh or excessive noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures, or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace, or safety of others, unless the making and continuing of the noise is necessary for the protection or preservation of property or the life, health, or safety of a person or persons.”

Unreasonably loud, harsh or excessive noise is defined as “any manufactured noise plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet from its point of origin or emanation”

2. Noise Emission Prohibitions (224.30-50)

“No person shall omit from the boundaries of his property or from any moving vehicle any noise that unreasonably interferes with the enjoyment of life or with any lawful business or activity...”

3. Mufflers — Noise Regulations (189.140)

“No person shall modify the exhaust system of a motor vehicle or an off highway vehicle in a manner which will amplify or increase the noise emitted by the motor of such vehicle above that emitted by the muffler originally installed on the vehicle.”

4. Noise (189.020)

“Every Vehicle... shall be so equipped as to make a minimum of noise, smoke, or other nuisance, to protect the rights of other traffic, and to promote the public safety...”

All of these laws and ordinances are punishable by heavy fines. The Louisville Metro Noise Ordinance adopted in April of 2005, assesses a \$100.00 fine for the first offense. No questions asked. No court date is assigned, and the fine is to be paid within 7 days. The fine is raised to \$250.00 for the second offense and \$500.00 for the third offense. If a defendant chooses to appeal an officer's citation to the Code Enforcement Board and loses, those fines increase. Instead of \$100.00 for the first offense the fine is increased to \$250.00 the second to \$500.00 and the third to \$1000.00.

With some of the laws and ordinances and their penalties clearly stated, hopefully I have addressed questions regarding the legality of vehicle noise. If there are further questions, as always, feel free to contact me at the Louisville Metro Police Department's Fourth Division at (502) 574-7010
